About the School ■

The School is preparing Boys and Girls for ICSE and ISC (+2) Examination. The Doon Cambridge School provides the fullest opportunity to a student to develop his/her all-round personality on addition to scholarly pursuits. The students are offered both the streams- Science and Commerce at the +2 level. Our achievements in academic has been remarkable - we generally have cent percent results with a higher tally of credits and distinction, in the examinations conduct by the ICSE, New Delhi, but equal emphasis is laid on extra curricular activities such as debates, declamations, dramatics, games, shooting, skating, science quiz contests, trek of hills, swimming, horse riding, health club, gymnasium and other adventure sports.

Separate campus for boys and girls hostel, modern buildings, highly qualified staff, boarding house with all amenities, nutritious food cooked under most hygienic conditions are provided. Run on public school lines, the school provides instructions from Nursery to Std. XII. It is affiliated to the Council for the Indian Certificate Examination, New Delhi and sends up students for the ICSE (10th) and ISC (12th) examination of the council. The school is a Government recognised, Co- educational, Day and Residential Institution, catering for Boarders, Day Boarders and Day Scholars, with English as the medium of instruction.

In common with all good Residential schools, the Doon Cambridge School provides a sound all-round education that helps produce the whole man. Though one emphasis is given on academic disciplines, stress is also laid on all round character building. We hope to produce citizens who are trained not merely in body and intellect, but have in some measure compassion for the less fortunate. To achieve this goal we provide opportunities for students to show initiative, to think for themselves and to develop a myriad of interests (Athletic and Cerebral).

Library

Laboratories

The school provides to the students, the use of Physics, Biology, Chemistry, Home Science and Psychology Laboratories equipped with the most modern apparatus. These encourage students to learn through experiment and research.

The school provides a well-equipped computer centre to make the students know and learn the new technology.

KINDERGARTEN.

The P.G. Nursery and K.G. classes are under the direct supervision of a trained, specialised, innovative and caring Senior Mistress who has vast experience of teaching in the play-way method.

The Nursery is equipped with up-to-date and modern apparatus. Special care and arrangements are made to create a 'homely atmosphere' in the new surroundings. The Nursery classes have been provided with extensive play apparatus of their own, which are going to be housed in a separate wing in the school campus in new form and shape. It will be a real Child's world.



School Activities ■

Studies are only of the means of developing a child's personality to its fullest and so emphasis is laid on various games and activities. The School offers the following activities which are conducted under the supervision of trained and experienced staff in six periods a week.

A part from the intensive study of the courses for the examinations, the school provides its students the facility of activities helping towards the all-round development of their personalities. These co-curricular activities provide sufficient opportunities for finding out the natural aptitude of the child and finally to select the vocational line of study. Doon Cambridge School regards education as a process by which a child is moulded into an emotionally balanced, physically healthy, intellectually objective and spiritually conscious individual who can fruitfully and happily live in society with others. The School seeks to make its students aware of these concerns and responsibilities through a well designed programme of formal and informal education.

The School has always held the belief that academic qualifications alone do not make individual truly educated. Through its curricular, co-curricular and extra curricular programmes, the school, therefore, encourages its students to avail themselves of many opportunities for total growth. Besides, Doon Cambridge School has enshrined in its customs and traditions an unwritten law of personal integrity to the service and respect for mankind. The school motto is a constant reminder of our responsibilities towards spreading the light of learning to the world at large.

The various clubs and societies functioning in the school aim to give expression to student's imagination and their talents. They organise debates, declamation contests, exhibitions, dramas, audio visual shows, hiking and trekking expeditions, quiz competitions, electronics and many other vocational projects. Clubs and Societies function regularly under the guidance of competent experienced Staff Incharge.



Games and Sports ■

Games are played with great keenness and spirit. The popular games played in the school are : Football, Hockey, Cricket, Badminton, Basketball, Throw ball, Table Tennis and Athletics. The School extends a hearty welcome to Parents/ Guardians on the eve of P.T.A. Meeting, Boxing Championship and Prize Distribution function. Swimming is a popular sport (with it's filtration plant) and is a scene of great activity.

School Report, Exams and Promotions ■

Besides monthly tests, Half-Yearly Examinations are held in December and Annual Examinations in March (except for the Board Examinations). No student is exempted from any examination. Pupils who fail to obtain promotion for two years will be asked to leave. No pupil will be allowed to appear for any examination unless full fees and dues are paid up. Promotions will be based on the results of Quarterly, Half-Yearly and Annual examinations. (Note- Pass marks are 40% in each subject.)

Housing System ■

The School is divided into four houses for competitive and disciplinary purposes named after four famous mountain ranges they are Andes, Woodroffe, Kilimangaro and Macdonell. The pupils are placed in one of these houses under House-Captains, Vice-Captains and School Captains. Each house is in the charge of two House Masters/ Mistress.

Attendance ■

The attendance will be taken at the beginning of each session and those who are not in class will be marked absent. The parents of pupils must ensure that their children reach school at least five minutes before the school begins. Late-comers must wait in detention class the same evening after the school, unless they produce a written explanation from their parents. Parents are earnestly requested to co-operate with school authorities and that children are regular and punctual. Leave of absence from the school, except in case of sudden illness or urgent necessity, must be applied in advance by parents or guardians. If a pupil is absent for a month without leave, his/her name will be struck off from the register and re-admission will be demanded.



Admission ■

The school is open for children of both sexes of the age group of three to seventeen years without distinction of caste and creed. Students are not admitted to a particular class until they have been tested and the school reserves to itself the right to admit, if accommodation is available, only to those classes for which they have been found fit. 10% seats are reserved for SC & ST students. Special fee concession is also given to the deserving candidates.

Complaints ■

All complaints, enquiries or correspondence are to be directly made to the Principal. Each holiday will be intimated to parents through the child on a slip.

School Uniform ■

Summer Uniform

Girls- White half sleeves shirt and pleated check skirt, school socks. Black shoes (Bata) school tie and belt white hair bands and school badge.

Boys- White half sleeves shirt, Navy blue trousers (2 pleats, 18" wide shorts (upto class V) school socks, black naughty boy shoes(with laces), school tie and belt, school badge and navy blue patka for sikh boys.

Winter Uniform

General- Grey pullovers with sky blue strips (v neck), white full sleeve shirt with grey woollen skirt/trousers, Grey blazers double breast with six gold buttons are compulsory from class I upwards gray woollen socks with school colours, schools tie and belt, white ribbons/bands/patka.

Interview ■

The Principal will be pleased to see Parents/ Guardians on every Monday and Tuesday between 9.00 A.M. to 10.00 A.M. during school hours by appointment.

No visitors are allowed to see pupils during school hours or to take them away from the school without written authority from the parent/guardian and the permission of the Principal. No parent/guardian is permitted to see any of the class teacher during class hours without the permission of the Principal

Awards ■

- Out-going students will sign "Honour Book" for:
- Regular good conduct and achievement in students.
- Proficiency in games.
- Students standing first and second in aggregate in the year's result will be awarded.
- Prize of events in sports and athletics will be awarded according to the merit of competitors by the Games Committee.
- The heads of activities will award "special mention" to those students whose work in extra curricular activities is outstanding.

Punctuality ■

Boarders must leave the hostel on the day the holiday commences and not a day earlier and must return to the hostel a day or two before the commencement of the term and not a day later.

Staff ■

A resident Principal, aided by the efficient House Masters, Matrons and Ayas, supervise the Hostel and are in attendance. Trained servants help the younger children to wash and dress. As they grow older, they are encouraged to do for themselves such things as making beds, cleaning shoes, washing socks and handkerchiefs. All children eat together in the dining hall under the supervision of the principal.

Medical Facility ■

Routine medical treatment during the school hours is provided by the school medical officers. Qualified doctor is in attendance for all the 24 hours. All major and minor ailments are treated in the hostel but serious cases are referred to Doon Hospital, Dehradun.

Outing ■

Picnic, hiking, trekking and visits to places of interest are arranged in the term particularly on public holidays.

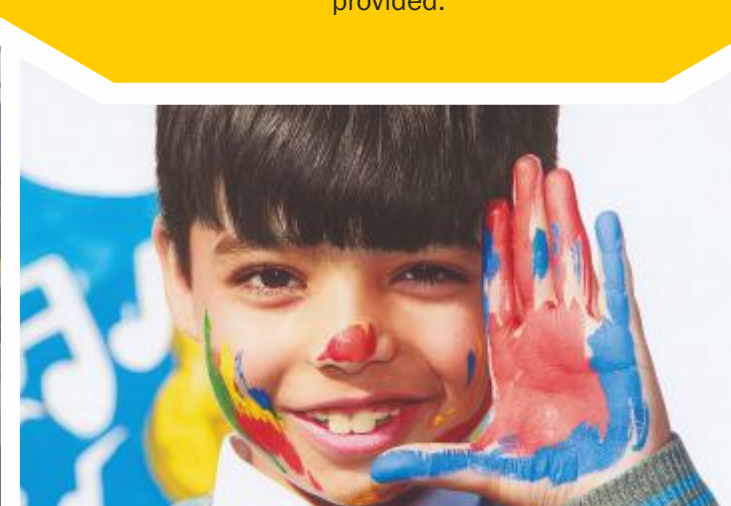
Visiting Boarders ■

Parents are requested not to visit the hostel on working days as this interferes with institution's routine. Parents on visit to the hostel on holidays may take their children out after getting the permission of the House Master. The boarders must return to the hostel by 6:00 pm. in time for studies.



Hostel Life ■

The hostel buildings are modern in architectural design and aesthetics. The hostel accommodation consists of dormitories for junior students and spacious rooms for the senior students. The rooms are well-lighted, well-ventilated and airy. They are conveniently furnished. The common room is a place for social interaction and recreation. There is a colour TV and VCR in the common room and newspapers and magazines are also provided.



Withdrawal ■■

No withdrawals are allowed during the middle of term. Parents intending to withdraw wards from the hostel at the end of a term will please give three months notice ending on the last day of the term. But fees shall be charged by the school for full one session. Fee once paid for the session is not refundable, but security money and money leftover from the impressed will be refunded.

Admission ■■

Application on the prescribed form must be accompanied by an age certificate and a non-refundable sum of Rs. 1000/-.

The hostel is open the children of both the sexes without distinction of caste or creed. Admission to hostel are granted by the principal after interview with both the parents and the pupil.

Fines ■■

A late arrival fine of Rs. 100/- per day per boarder will be charged unless a medical certificate is furnished or prior permission had been granted by the principal only.

Charges ■■

All fee must be paid in advance by the 10th of April and October, failing which a fine of Rs. 100/- will be charged upto 20th and after 20th the name will be struck off and re-admission fees Rs. 1000/- will be demanded. Stationary, toilets, clothing, pocket money, tonics, medicines, shoes repairing, laundry and electricity will be charged extra. The bill of personal expenses of the boarders will be sent on the first day of alternate month, which should be paid by 10th failing which a fine of Rs. 25/- will be charged in that month Rs. 50/- subsequent months. No reduction is made for broken periods, money, tonics, medicines, shoes repairing, laundry and electricity will be charged extra. The bill of personal expenses of the boarders will be sent on the first day of alternate month, which should be paid by 10th failing for broken periods.

Fines ■■

Vegetarian and non-vegetarian food is served to the children, milk, butter, eggs and fruits are served daily and non-veg. on alternate days. On the advice to the medical officer, special diet is also arranged.

Terms ■■

There are three terms in each year, 1st term from April to September, 2nd term September to December and 3rd Term from January to March.

The hostel is closed for about 6 weeks in summer and 2 weeks winters and it is necessary for all the boarders to go home during holidays as the staff are given leave during these long holidays.

Parents of foreign and overseas students are requested to ensure to the Bursar of the Institution that all pupils are in possession of valid passport and other travel documents. The school will not undertake the responsibility for procuring such documents and will not arrange travel by Air, Sea or Rail for holidays pertaining there to are furnished by the parents for necessary flight, passage or journey.

If the parents, want to meet the child the term on Sunday/public holidays, they must inform the institution at least 3 days before they arrive and taking him alongwith them between 10 a.m. & 5 p.m. must inform 1 week before in written.

No student is permitted to leave the boarding campus for any leave unless the parents call for the child personally.

Parents are permitted to visit their child/children on Sunday only between 10 a.m. & 5 p.m. and on public holiday.

The school will not be held responsible if a child leaves the boarding campus without written permission from the Principal or the House Master on the Campus.

Co-curricular Activities ■■

Medical Facilities and Hygiene ■■

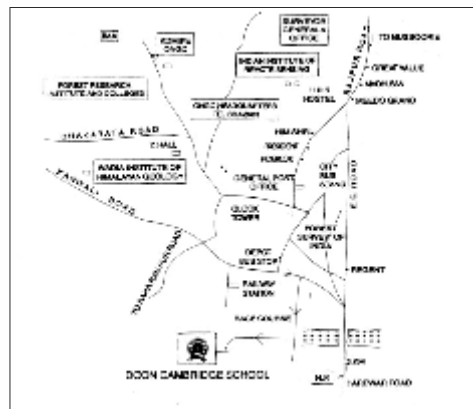
Facilities for proper and prompt medical aid are available during school hours. One in a year medical examination of the student is done with the objective to maintain their physical & Mental fitness. Stringent safety standards are adhered to strictly. Hygiene is an absolute priority. Classes and toilets are specially designed to meet this end. Continuous water supply is available. Thanks to Ganga river flowing at a short pace from school site.

Registration : It is the first stage of the admission process. A registration fee must be submitted along with the application and registration form specifying the class and the year.

Entrance Examination : Every student registered for admission to classes Nursery to IX has to qualify an entrance Examination made for the respective classes.

Personal Interview : Having qualified the Entrance Exam, the student has to appear for an interview taken by the Admission Selection Committee. The clearance of which is a must.
